being trusted means you've proven that you can handle the task at hand. Showing that we can be trusted with what's expected of us is a perfect way to begin the new year! Below please find a few helpful strategies from our *Core Values* program:



- "Praise your child when they accomplish a goal! Tell them you
 are proud of them and most imporantly that they should be proud of themselves!"
- "Encourage your child to take responsibility for their accomplishments, as well as for their struggles. Children that understand that they will sometimes make mistakes but will still be loved by their family are more likely to listen to feedback when they make a mistake at school."
- Ask a grown up: "What are some of your responsibilities at work? What happens if you don't follow through on your responsibilities"
- Ask a child: "Who do you know that shows responsibility? What are some ways you could try to show more responsibility?"
