
Six-Word Stories Strike a Chord with NAHS Students

Washington School Students Have Fun With Science

Students in Mrs. Sauchelli's 5th grade class discovered the role fungi plays in creating soil. In the activity, students planned and conducted an investigation to discover the factors affecting decomposition. After creating mold terrariums, they observed patterns in the rates of change of the mold. Students also noted similarities and differences when analyzing how mold grows on different foods under different conditions.



NAHS Bowling With a Record Breaking Season

The 2017-2018 NAHS Bowling Season was a special one without a doubt. The team was lead by seniors Kenny Bennett and Brandon Barth where they all persevered through each challenge they encountered. Led by Coach Daniel Farinola, the team became the NJIC Meadowlands Division Champions during the regular season with a win against rival Lyndhurst, finishing with an undefeated record of 22-0, a feat that has never been done by the Vikings' bowling team in previous seasons. Their league title was the first in bowling since 2009 and is the most recent since the boys' soccer team won the league title in 2015.

As if the league title wasn't a big enough accomplishment, the team also won 2 other prestigious titles before winning a state championship. They won the Bergen County Group 1 and 2 championship and also won the Baker's Bonanza Tournament. Both championship victories solidified that the Vikings were one of the top teams in Bergen County this season. To finalize this historic run, the Vikings won the North 1A Group 1 State

Championship, where Kenny Bennett nearly bowled a perfect game with a score of 283! For Liam Henkel, Kenny Bennett, Brandon Bath, it was their second State title in three years. The victory sent them to the tournament of champions where they placed 4th among Group 1 schools and 15th overall in the entire state! The team set school records with a team high series for 4 bowlers of 2414, a team high game for 5 bowlers of 1111 and a team high series for 5 bowlers of 2973.

In addition to the team's successes, there were several individual noteworthy accomplishments, including Kenny Bennett and Brandon Barth advancing to the Individuals Tournament of Champions.

Finally, with all of the success of the boys' team over the last couple of years, several girls showed interest in the bowling team this past season. The interest led to our first girls' bowling club and if the interest continues to grow, there is hope that a girls' team will be formed in the near future.

NAMS "Hoops for Heart"

"Hoops for Heart" is an annual fundraiser that the middle school physical education department runs with the American Heart Association. Each grade level competes in a different basketball style, heart healthy activity. Eighth grade students compete in a 3 on 3 basketball tournament; seventh grade students compete in a hot shot contest, and the sixth grade students travel to a number of different basketball and heart healthy stations. The sixth grade also competes against other homerooms, which is judged on their skills, team spirit, heart health knowledge, and amount of money raised. This is an extremely fun day that all the students always look forward to. Overall, the middle school was able to raise almost \$900 for the American Heart Association.









North Arlington High School: "Start With Hello!"

"Start With Hello" week at North Arlington High School kicked off on February 5, 2018. "Start With Hello" week brings attention to the growing epidemic of social isolation in our schools and communities, and empowers young people to create a culture of inclusion, while connecting with others throughout the school. During this week, hundreds of schools and youth organizations across the United States participated in "Start With Hello" week, which teaches students, grades 2–12, the skills they need to reach out to and include those who may be dealing with chronic social isolation and create a culture of inclusion and connectedness.
