Superintendent's Statement

This meeting is open to the public for the purpose of addressing any subject matter that is pertinent to and/or directly related to the operation of the North Arlington Public School District. Residents wishing to speak on such items are required to state their names, addresses and subject matter. Pursuant to Board Bylaw 0167, Public Participation in Board Meetings, comments are limited to 5 minutes duration.

The Board may (or may not) respond to issues raised by members of the public at the time they are raised, but will provide a response if and when appropriate. However, the Board cannot directly respond to the issues regarding personnel, in order to protect the privacy rights of the individual.

Please be advised that there is no privilege or qualified privilege with regard to any statements that you make before the Board. What this means is that while you are certainly free to exercise your right to comment on issues before the Board, such comments are considered public statements, and may be responded to or acted upon by any individuals affected by them. The Board will, of course, consider your comments as they relate to its obligations to effectively govern the North Arlington School District, but cannot offer protection from any action that a third-party may elect to pursue as a result of any statements offered during public session.

VII. HEARING OF THE PUBLIC

Any members of the public wishing to be heard please stand, state your name and address for the record.

Ruth Hayes, 629 New Jersey Avenue – N.A. Ms. Hayes said that she has four children in the school district. She read a prepared speech on her disapproval with students wearing masks in school. She said that she sent the Superintendent multiple emails which he did not respond to. Ms. Hayes also cited that 160 districts have moved to "masks optional" and cited four school districts: Clifton, Lyndhurst, Nutley, and Rutherford. She urged the Superintendent to make masks optional for children.

The Superintendent asked Ms. Hayes to please provide him with the emails that she says he did not respond to because he has responded to every email. She then stated that he did respond, but her questions were not answered. The Superintendent also said that there are approximately 675 school districts and that those districts are in the minority and that North Arlington is one of the districts in the majority who are adhering to Governor Murphy's Executive Order 251.

Victor Furtado, 140 Riverview Avenue, N.A. – Mr. Furtado said that North Arlington is in the minority and that masking in schools is not a law, that it was a masking mandate. The Superintendent stated that for all intent purposes it is law, and we will continue to follow the law.

Diana Furtado, 140 Riverview Avenue, N.A. – Ms. Furtado said that her son followed all the guidelines and mandates for masks, had a medical excuse, but stated that the school denied it because they followed Governor Murphy's mandates. She said that they had to leave the school district because of this.

The Superintendent said that the Board is aware of the case and will not discuss it publicly due to student privacy.

Donald O'Neill, 13 Williams Street, N.A. - Mr. O'Neill said that the district received ESSER funding and asked what is being done with the money.

The Superintendent said that the School Business Administrator would be able to provide you information of how the grant is structured. He also said that it is public information and that it had to be used for certain areas such as mental wellness of students.

The School Business Administrator asked Mr. O'Neill if he would like a full run down of all grant funding.

Mr. O'Neill responded that he would just OPRA the information.

6. MOTION TO APPROVE THE JOINT TRANSPORTATION AGREEMENT & SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH SOUTH BERGEN JOINTURE COMMISSION FOR THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

WHEREAS, the North Arlington Board of Education does hereby approve an agreement with the South Bergen Jointure Commission, an approved Coordinated Transportation Services Agency, for the purposes of transporting students in accordance with Chapter 53, P.L. 1977 for the time period 2022-2023 school year. The services to be provided include, but are not limited to the Coordinated Transportation of nonpublic, out of district special education, vocational and summer programs.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the North Arlington Board of Education agrees to abide by the Transportation Services Agreement as published by the South Bergen Jointure Commission.

WHEREAS, the SBJC is desirous of amending the terms of the agreement to memorialize the NABOE's responsibility to continue its payment obligations to the SBJC in the event of school closures due to health-related reasons to ensure full compliance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9.

NOW THEREFORE, THE PARTIES AGREE as follows:

- 1. For the term of the 2022-2023 school year, if schools are closed and/or operating under virtual or remote instruction as a result of the current public health emergency, thereby, the NABOE shall continue to make payments under its agreement with the SBJC, as if the school facilities remained open, for the SBJC to pay its contracted transportation service providers in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9.
- 2. All Other terms and conditions of the agreement not addressed herein shall remain in full force and effect.
